The Judging Advisor will be responsible for the provision of guidance and advice on all judging matters in accordance with the Technical Committee Terms of Reference and Regulations through the following actions -

- Working with the Gymnastics NZ Education Manager to develop and implement judge education within the National Education Framework as that relates to an annual education and training programme.
- Provide technical advice and support to Gymnastics NZ on improvements and developments to the manuals, resources, courses and training forums for judges.
- Ensuring the Code is in alignment with the FIG Code of Points by:
 - Providing advice on regulations;
 - Determining technical rules;
 - Advising of international amendments and innovations including any variations.
- In line with the National Education Framework, and in conjunction with the Education & Events Managers
 - Verify logbooks and results from judging courses.
 - Verify judging panels for competitions – national, regional and sanctioned, including control judges.
- In collaboration with the GNZ Education Manager, establish a development and succession plan for judges.
- Where appropriate, consult or liaise with, Gymnastics NZ employees, key stakeholders, advisory groups and the wider Code community.
- Where required consult with the Judging Advisor of other Technical Committees to share best practice and cross Code alignments.
- Work in collaboration with the TC Chairperson to contribute the required judging elements to the draft annual TC Work Plan

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- Attend a minimum of three Technical Committee meetings per year and, where required, attend meetings requested by the Gymnastics NZ Board or Chief Executive Officer.

Desired criteria:

- International Brevet qualification and experience.
- Technical knowledge and understanding of the Code that demonstrates a high level of competence.
- Experience as a presenter at judges education courses.
- Demonstrated collegial, collaborative and effective relationships within the Code and wider gymnastics community.
- Strong knowledge of international trends.
- Excellent organization, administration and planning skills.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
