By awarding excellent artistry performances, we hope to encourage more emphasis and understanding of the Artistry requirements introduced by FIG in 2022. There will be one award for Beam, and one award for Floor, for each step, overs and unders combined The recipient of each Artistry Award will be decided by the judging panels of Beam and Floor after day one of competition at the event. This will be assessed based on the FIG Artistry deductions that were introduced in this Olympic cycle. This will not necessarily be the highest floor or beam scores. A gymnast may have a fall but still demonstrate excellent artistry and therefore be a contender for an Artistry award.
